



Mandala Flower Pin Cushion

(Photo Tutorial and Pattern Pieces)

In 2 sizes: 4.5" and 6" in diameter (without petals)



Pattern & Instructions

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Mandala Flower Pin Cushion

Thank you for downloading this pattern. I hope you will enjoy making one or many pin cushions with it.

Before printing the pattern, make sure you selected "Print Actual Size" in your printer settings.

Materials needed:

- ✿ Several scrap pieces of cotton fabric
- ✿ A couple of buttons for the top and bottom of the pin cushion
- ✿ Stuffing material (Polyfill)

Let's get started!

Instructions



Cut out

- ✿ **8 pieces of the top triangles**
- ✿ **8 pieces of the bottom triangles**
- ✿ **8 big petals for the top side**
- ✿ **8 big petals for the underside**
- ✿ **8 small petals for the top side**
- ✿ **8 small petals for the underside**
- ✿ **8 small petals from interfacing**
- ✿ **8 large petals from interfacing**



Iron the interfacing to the back side of the top fabric of the big and small petal pieces.



Take 2 triangles of the top and bottom triangles each, put them right sides together and sew them together along one edge.



Take 2 of the sewn together triangle pieces each, put them right sides together and sew them together along one edge.



Put 2 of the sewn pieces right sides together and sew them together as shown in the picture.

Leave a gap of about 1-1.5" on the bottom part piece.



Now you completed the top and bottom part of the pin cushion.

Put a top and bottom piece of fabric of the small and big petals right sides together each and sew them together, leaving the bottom edges open.



Snip off any extra fabric, clip the corners, turn the petals inside out and press.



Pin the small petals to the top fabric, facing the right side of the top pin cushion part and stitch them together.





Now pin the large petals on top in the same way, with their centre aligning with the gap between the smaller petals and sew them in place.



Now I pin the petals down from the left side, so they won't get in the way when I sew the bottom part to the top part of the pin cushion.



Pin the top and bottom circles together and sew along the outer edge.



Turn the fabric inside out through the turning hole.



Stuff the pin cushion through the opening.



Close the opening by hand.

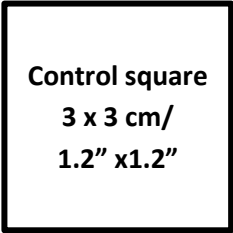
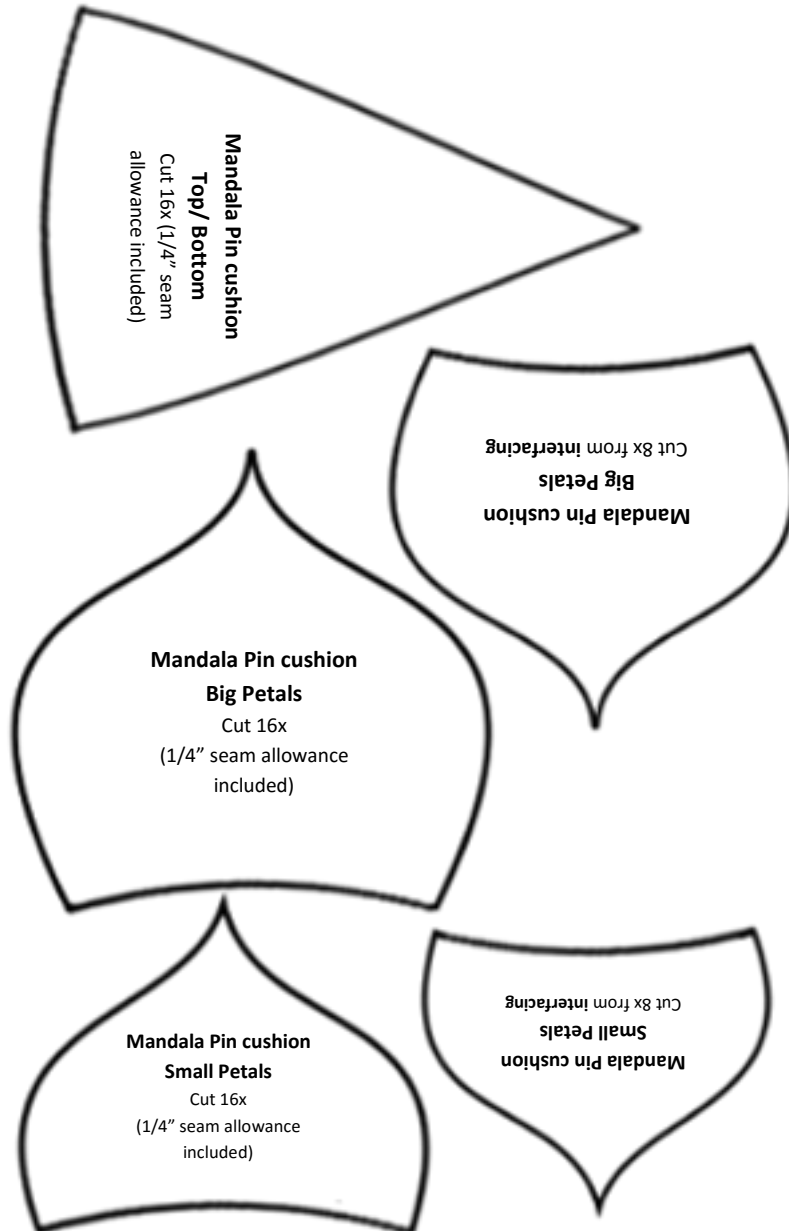


Pick a button for the top and bottom centre of the pin cushion and sew them together, going from the top through to the bottom with the needle, squishing the pin cushion together in the centre, to flatten the pin cushion and give it a firmer structure.

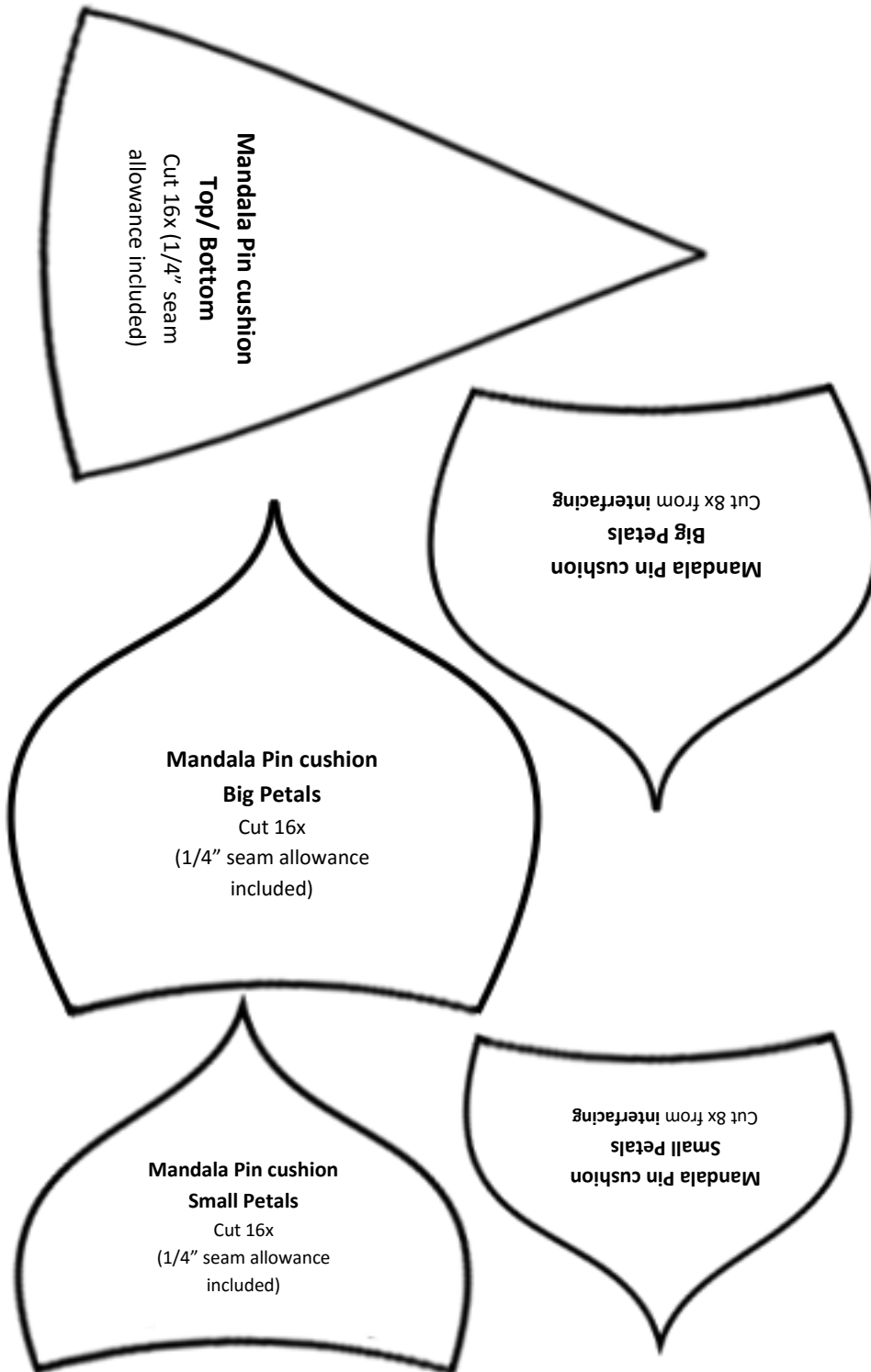
All done. I hope you enjoyed this little project 😊
